About Brock University

Brock University is a comprehensive institution with rich academic programs and world-class research activity. Located in Ontario's scenic Niagara region on the traditional territory of the Haudenosaunee and Anishinaabe people, Brock is situated in a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve. With nearly 600 full-time faculty members and researchers, Brock's robust academic scope offers more than 70 undergraduate programs and 50 graduate programs in seven dynamic Faculties. The University's 19,000 students come from across Canada and around the world. Brock's renowned student experience is enriched by an emphasis on experiential education, as illustrated by community partnerships and volunteerism.



About St. Catharines

St. Catharines is located in southern Ontario, approximately 1 hour from Toronto, and 19km inland from the international boundary with New York State, USA. St. Catharines is the largest city in Canada's Niagara region and the sixth largest urban area in Ontario. St. Catharines has a humid continental climate with four distinct seasons. The average summer temperature is 25°C with winter temperatures dropping as low as -20 °C. The temperature begins to drop in October/November and rise again in April/May. The Niagara Peninsula is the largest wine-producing area in Canada — this draws a great deal of tourism to the region for wine tours and tastings. St. Catharines carries the official nickname of the "Garden City" due to its 1,000 acres of parks, gardens, and trails. It is 15 minutes to Niagara Falls, a world wonder that sits on the international border of Canada and the United States.



Nominations

Partners will be required to complete their nominations by:

March 31 for a September start date

October 1 for a January start date

Important note: It is highly advised that January start students are nominated as soon as possible (same time as the September start deadline). There is only one course registration period at Brock which begins in June, courses can fill up quickly and limit any students who are nominated late. Having students nominated and admitted early will allow for more options and flexibility for courses.

After we receive your nomination, our office will send the student our Student Exchange/Program Application.

Language requirements

All courses at Brock University are taught in English, with the exception of various language courses that are taught predominantly in the given language.

Which courses may students request?

In general, as long as a student has the necessary academic background, they are able to request permission to join courses from any Faculty at Brock. Students are also able to take elective credits from a variety of departments and are not restricted to choosing courses from only one department.

Notes about courses

Our postgraduate Teacher Education courses (EDUC 8P**), GAME, Co-Op, and internship/placement courses are not open to visiting students; only Education classes at the Undergrad level are open.

Most Child and Youth Studies and Accounting courses are also not open to visiting students. Some Computer Sciences and Visual Arts courses are restricted.

Courses with "ON" in the course code are not for academic credit, and are not available for exchange students.

Some courses require portfolio application, such as musical audition, creative writing & art portfolios. These courses are generally available for visiting students to request, as long as they provide the required supporting materials on time.

System of assessment

Students are assessed throughout the semester and will be expected to complete written assignments, midterm tests, and final examinations. Students will be informed of the assessment schedule at the beginning of each term. "Re-sits" do not exist in Canada.

Exams/grading

The grading system is as follows:

- A (80-100%)** Indicates excellent to outstanding work
- B (70-79%)** Indicates competent work
- C (60-69%)** Indicates adequate work
- D (50-59%)** Indicates that the minimum requirements are barely satisfied
- F (<49%)** Requirements not met; no credit will be given

Students should plan to remain at Brock University until the final day of the exam period.

Visa information

Students studying at Brock University for more than six months must obtain a Study Permit. Study periods of less than six months do not require a Study Permit.

We will work with nominated students to provide accurate travel and study permit information once nominated. In addition to a Study Permit, citizens of certain countries also require a Temporary Resident Visa in order to enter Canada. Residence

Students have 2 options to choose from: on-campus housing or off-campus living. Our office will assist students with picking the most ideal option for them, as each style is quite unique.

On-campus accommodation offers a very typical North American experience. Students can choose a private or shared room within our traditional, semi-suite and self-catered options. All students must purchase a meal plan and have tenant insurance for their time abroad.

Please note: published prices are listed for 8 months. One-semester students should divide the cost in half.

The on-campus application deadline for September, including deposits, is June 2. Winter semester students are accepted on a first come first served basis. Students apply for residence on their my.brocku.ca portal.

Off-campus housing provides opportunities to live in the local community alongside upper year students. St. Catharines and the surrounding cities are quite student- focused with bus service to the University. Rent can cost approximately \$500-\$800 a month, depending on amenities that are included. Local transportation

All students are required to purchase a bus pass as part of their fees at Brock University. This pass will allow students to have unlimited travel throughout the Niagara region, and to and from the university each day.

Student Success Centre (SSC)

The SSC offers a variety of free support services for students to access during their time at Brock. Services include academic skills workshops, study rooms, drop-in tutoring and leadership development.

Student Accessibility Services (SAS)

The SAS offers a variety of support services for students. Any student who has a disability should indicate this on their application to study at Brock. We will connect the student with a case worker in the SAS so that we can plan for a smooth transition and successful exchange term.

Medical coverage

Supplemental health insurance (i.e. coverage for prescription drugs, dental care, etc.) is provided through the Brock University Students' Union (BUSU). Students paying tuition to Brock will automatically be enrolled in this plan and can opt-out if they wish. Exchange students who pay their fees to their home school will have the option to opt-in within the first month of courses. Questions about UHIP can be directed to uhip@brocku.ca. Student Health Services

There is a medical clinic on-campus at Brock that is staffed by doctors and nurses. All students have access to this clinic as well as to the on-campus pharmacy. The clinic offers a variety of services such as medical

care and treatment, health examinations, allergy injections, sexual health advising, and massage therapy. Student Health Services offers free and confidential counselling services to students. Mental health support services are very important at Brock.
